Key Facts About HIV/AIDS

- HIV (Human Immunodeficiency Virus) attacks the immune system and, if untreated, leads to AIDS.- HIV is mainly spread through unprotected sex, sharing needles, and from mother to child during childbirth or breastfeeding.
- The virus does not spread through casual contact, such as shaking hands or sharing food.
- Using condoms correctly and consistently reduces the risk of HIV transmission by more than 90%.- Early detection through regular testing and proper treatment can help people with HIV live long, healthy lives.

Why Are Commercial Drivers at Higher Risk?

1. Long periods away from home can lead to risky behaviors.
2. Exposure to high-risk environments, including commercial sex work.
3. Lack of access to healthcare and regular HIV testing.
4. Misinformation about HIV transmission and prevention.
5. Peer pressure and social influences while on the road.

How to Protect Yourself from HIV/AIDS

Staying safe and preventing HIV is possible with the right steps:

- Use condoms every time you have sex.
- Get tested regularly to know your HIV status.
- Avoid sharing needles or other sharp objects.
- Stick to one sexual partner and ensure they are tested.
- Educate yourself and others about the risks of HIV/AIDS.
- If exposed to HIV, seek medical help immediately for post-exposure prophylaxis (PEP).

Living a Healthy Life with HIV

If you are diagnosed with HIV, it is not the end of the road. With proper treatment (antiretroviral therapy - ART), people with HIV can lead normal lives. Adhering to treatment, maintaining a healthy diet, and staying informed are crucial.
